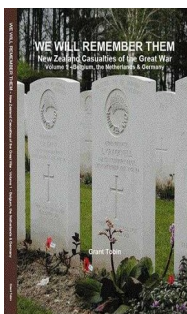


Book Review

“We will remember them” by Grant Tobin

One of the World War 1 memorial projects is a series of books on New Zealand's war dead graves.

The first 2 of 5 volumes have just arrived at Puke Ariki and are displayed on the new books stand in the Taranaki Research Room. Vol. 1 covers Belgium, Netherlands and Germany and Vol. 2 France and Switzerland.



The books themselves present little new but are an amalgam of the Commonwealth War Graves data and the NZEF war dead CD that we have in the library.

They are different in being dedicated to just NZ soldiers who died in WW1 and presented by country then cemetery. In addition each volume is supplemented by a CD with photos of all the graves, general photos of each cemetery plus an application for Google Earth (still to be installed by library at time of my inspection) and TomTom GPS units.

At the rear of each volume is a list of the GPS references for each cemetery followed by a complete index.

The books are well presented in soft cover format. The only slight fault I could find was on the CD where the individual grave photos are not named or in any particular order but the photos themselves are good.

While the information is not new the books will appeal to people who prefer a dedicated publication and/or are more comfortable with a written format.

Search Tip

This is from the Somerset and Dorset Family History Society page on Facebook, posted by Roy Stockdill.

This tip is not specifically related to Somerset & Dorset genealogy research but it may prove useful - valuable, even - to newer and lesser experienced family historians. When you are searching the births, marriages and deaths on the FreeBMD website, try this technique.....

Leave the surname field BLANK and put in the first name(s) field a surname that you are interested in, preceded by a plus symbol. Pressing Find will then bring up all those entries where your chosen surname has been used as a middle name or a first name! For instance, entering "+STOCKDILL" produces eight entries in which my name was given as a middle name and one entry in which it was a given first name.

Of course, this works best with the rarer surnames, but it can be very useful in finding ancestors and relatives you may have missed with a normal search, and it's also VERY good for one-name studies.

In my examples, this is how some years ago I found a girl called SARAH STOCKDILL RIDOUT, who was born at Gillingham (the Dorset one) in 1863 and married at Lambeth in 1885. She does not appear to have been related to me or my family but I believe my great great uncle and his wife were close friends of her family.

Remember.....

1) Put nothing in the surname field, leave it BLANK.

2) Enter your surname - or whatever surname you're interested in - in the first name(s) field with a PLUS symbol in front of it. An asterisk works as well but it doesn't produce those entries where the surname has been used as a first name alone, only as a middle name.

3) Do the search.

Try it! I did try it with my PURCHASE surname and got 16 hits in the births. Unfortunately I do not know what connection any may have to my research but it worked.

These will be recycled to generate some income for the branch.



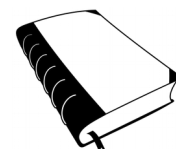
