#### **Last Event: The Boneless Boy**

At our July meeting, Ann Evans spoke to us about her great-grandmother's brother, Hugh Mattison (1855-1937), a colourful character. Hugh was born in Melbourne, came over to NZ at the age of 5, and died in Auckland, New Zealand. Hugh married in 1895.

He was known as the "Boneless Boy" because of his famous contortionist acts in Cook's circus and Wirth Bros' circus.

Ann found a wealth of information on two good sites: <u>paperspast</u> and <u>Trove</u>, the Australian equivalent. In 1931 in the



Auckland Star, there was an interview with Hugh which gave Ann plenty of avenues for further research. He was part of a whaling crew, saw Buffalo Bill in the USA, had a connection with Ned Kelly and his gang in Australia.

At 11 years of age, he ended up in Australia in the circus there, eventually running away from it because of bad treatment. He tramped through the Waikato and ended up in the Bay of Islands where he, a young boy, joined a whaling crew, crewing for one shilling a month. He talked about his close encounter with a whale. This whaling ship took him to America. From Massachusetts he worked his way to Quebec and on to San Francisco. These were the lawless days of early USA. In Chicago, he saw Buffalo Bill, a popular figure of the time. Hugh went back to Australia where gold had just been discovered.

An article in the Auckland Star put Hugh in NZ in 1889. This article told of him nearly drowning in Auckland.

Ann used <u>Victoria Outwards</u>, the electoral rolls, postal directories, cemetery sites and newspapers in her quest for information on Hugh.

Thank you for a well-illustrated and interesting talk, Ann.

### **Convenor's Report**

I am looking forward to the events that our Branch has organised for Family History Month in August, which are detailed elsewhere in this newsletter. I hope you are able to take the opportunity to attend the events that may be able to help you with your Family Research.

The Taranaki Biographical Index has just been updated with the addition of over 27,000 new records. Over 10,000 are death records, covering the period up until 1940. This index is a great finding aid, to assist local members and visiting researchers to locate records in our library, relating to the names they are researching.

We have a small group of keen people who do the data entry and checking of the records that are added to the Taranaki Biographical Index. There are still a large number of records in our Library that need indexing, and the more data that can be made available to researchers the more use our library will be, to yourself and visitors.

I am appealing to you all to consider helping with our Branch indexing project. All you need is a spare hour here and there to assist us enlarge our valuable asset. If you are able to use a computer keyboard, then typing in the data from paper records is for you. On the other hand if you do not have any typing skills, then checking only needs your eyesight and a pencil, as we can print out the newly inputted records and you can check them against the originals. If you think that you would like to help, please contact myself or Lorraine Austin, and we will be only too happy to explain how you can help.

### **DNA with Ancestry**

The DNA testing available from ancestry.com is heavily advertised, but it isn't always very clear that many of the features aren't available without an ongoing subscription.

If you've purchased a DNA test, these features will remain available without a subscription:

- Ethnicity estimate
- DNA matches
- · Genetic Communities
- Automatic updates to your ethnicity estimate, DNA matches, and Genetic communities as updates are released and our database of users grows
- Shared matches
- Contacting matches

Without a subscription, these features won't be available:

- New Ancestry Discoveries
- DNA Circles
- · Shared Ancestor Hints
- Viewing your matches' trees
- Lists of surnamed and birth locations that appear both your tree and your matches' trees

### **A4 Envelopes Please**


If you have any used A4 envelopes, please consider donating these to the branch library. They are used for filing library materials.
